




GS Strategy Group, a Boise based survey research firm, conducted this survey via phone and online responses on behalf of PACT. The survey was conducted November 13-19, 2025, among 1,000 Likely Voters nationwide. Telephone respondents were reached at random using registered voter lists from all 50 states and Washington, DC. Online respondents were randomly selected from online panels. The survey yielded a margin of error of +/- 3.1% at the 95% confidence level.


76% of voters say their cost-of-living has gone up, and even more say Congress has done a poor job holding down costs.




Insurance fraud and lawsuit abuse are viewed as big problems and a major factor driving up the cost of goods and services for Americans.





...And other key pieces of legislation – providing Congress an opportunity to give voters much needed economic relief.


The American Consumer Savings Act aims to bring down the costs of food, insurance, transportation, and healthcare by ending lawsuit abuse in America.

The Lawsuit Abuse Reduction Act restores accountability to the legal system by providing penalties for filing baseless, meritless and frivolous lawsuits. It imposes monetary sanctions against lawyers who file frivolous lawsuits, including the attorney's fees and costs incurred by the victim of the frivolous lawsuit.

The formation of a Department of Justice taskforce to investigate staged accident fraud cases where ambulance lawyers and their network of medical providers recruit victims to fake their injuries and then inflate their treatment needs to boost lawsuit payouts.







These cost-of-living issues are potent among voters heading into the midterms.
