Here is some more information about proposals to reform the cost of lawsuits, settlements, and legal fees in New York.

This proposal would crack down on insurance fraud and staged accidents that drive up the cost of auto insurance in New York. Prosecutors would have more power to go after scammers and fraudsters, insurance companies would strengthen their anti-fraud programs, damages would be limited for drivers who engage in unlawful behavior or who are mostly at fault for accidents, and consumers would get additional protections to make sure insurance companies pay legitimate claims quickly and pass along savings from lawsuit reform to customers.

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Here are statements that supporters and opponents might make about these reforms.

Supporters say New Yorkers pay the highest auto insurance rates in the country — \$1,500 more than the national average — because of fraud and abuse by billboard lawyers. Supporters say we need lawsuit reform and consumer protections to make sure families get lower insurance rates. **[SPLIT A]**

Supporters say New Yorkers pay the highest auto insurance rates in the country — \$1,500 more than the national average — because of fraud and abuse by billboard lawyers. In Georgia and Florida, auto insurance rates are decreasing for hundreds of thousands of drivers after their state legislatures tackled lawsuit abuse by billboard lawyers, saving policyholders hundreds of dollars a year. **[SPLIT B]**

Opponents say more regulations will harm the legitimate victims of serious accidents by limiting their ability to get compensated for their injuries, and that lawsuit reforms will only protect big insurance companies that don't want to pay settlements after accidents.
